

President's Message

The past two years have been challenging for the 2SLGBTQIA+ community. There has been an alarming 60% increase in homophobic and transphobic hate and violence projected towards the 2SLGBTQIA+ community. The increasing attacks on the transgender individuals is life threatening for youth. Oxford County has experienced a significant increase of homophobia and transphobic rhetoric and acts of violence that have included hateful demonstrations attacking the 2SLGBTQIA+ community in Oxford County. Destruction and theft of pride flags, gasoline was poured on the Tillsonburg crosswalk, threats to children and families at drag story time events, and attacks on local businesses that support the 2SLGBTQIA+ community. These behaviours are unacceptable, dangerous and overall have prompted Oxford County into the National media spotlight. This is not the light we want to shine on our community. As a result, safety and security is our primary focus throughout all our pride events in 2024.

The 2SLGBTQIA+ community has a long history of hate and discrimination based on heterosexual norms or religious morality. We have been criminalized, institutionalized, banned from adopting children, had to fight for duel parental rights, advocate for marital rights, medical rights, pension rights, these are just a few barriers removed by the generations before us. We have fought too long and hard for human rights, regression is NOT an option in 2024!

The current political propaganda projected by conservative Premiers throughout Canada is a clear attack on the 2SLGBTQIA+ community, specifically transgender individuals. This is an attempt to continue to oppress and create false narratives involving children and the 2SLGBTQIA+ community. This is harmful, done with intent and ultimately puts 2SLGBTQIA+ youth at risk. We know the suicide statistics of 2SLGBTQIA+ youth are 4x more likely to attempt self harm/ suicide due to bullying, unsupportive families that results in homelessness. We have no choice but to continue to advocate, educate and fight for the rights of everyone in the 2SLGBTQIA+community, regression is not progression!

In light of the rising political discourse the Oxford County Pride committee continues to prevail, succeed and exceed in our events, opportunities and community connections. Last year's Oxford Pride events experienced the highest number of attendees, a record number of events and support from community partners. We choose to celebrate our success and progress promoting diversity, inclusion and equity for all in Oxford County. We will continue to correct false narratives, educate against lies and propaganda while we advocate, ensuring the saftey and security of all 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals.

When the Oxford County Pride committee evolved in 2015, we created history in the raising of the first pride flag at museum Square in Woodstock. The journey to accomplish our goal of flying Pride Flags in every Township throughout Oxford County has been an uphill battle. The national spotlight that Oxford County experienced was disheartening, however this prompted the 2SLGBTQIA+ community and our allies to mobilized and activate. Demonstrating that advocacy, connection and compassion in community makes a difference for everyone! I am proud to say we are celebrating the raising of progress pride flags in every township throughout Oxford County

in 2024! A special thanks to the Norwich Love and Acceptance Group as their collective action, group coordination and willingness to challenge heterosexual norms for community inclusion was astounding. It is more important now more than ever for us to heal and provide unity throughout our community. Oxford County has no room for bigotry or discrimination of any kind. We are proud of the progress of our Oxford County Pride events and the amazing work our committee accomplishes! We have gone from a small picnic in a park to dozens of events and partnerships throughout the month of June with hundreds of people in attendance. We are excited to say Oxford Pride Family Day is one of the best attended downtown Woodstock summer festival events.

The 2024 Oxford County Pride theme is "Love is Louder"! Our message is to embrace love, compassion, inclusion and diversity through our community. We will continue to grow stronger in the face of adversity, and promote equity for all in Oxford County to live, work and play.

In closing I must express gratitude for the Oxford County Pride committee members, our executive team and the many volunteers who assist and continue to donate their time. Special thanks to my children who inspire me everyday to do this work to ensure they grow up in a safe equitable community free of homophobia, transphobia and discrimination! Thank you Oxford County for your support and we look forward to your attendance at our events throughout the month of June 2024.





The way gender is presented and communicated to the world through clothing, speech, body language, hairstyle, voice and/or the emphasisor deemphasis of body characteristics and behaviours.





Guardians in Action (Formerly Drag Storytime Guardians)

On April 30th, Sista Patricia gathered a small group of sister motorcycle riders and went to the Parkhill Library to provide support for a Drag Storytime. What they found when they arrived was a group of protesters with hateful banners, yelling anti-queer messages and a very ignorant homophobic woman with a bullhorn. The scene was so hateful that the women went to the front door and linked arms to ensure that they were kept back from the entrance. Families and their young children were forced to walk through a gauntlet of hate being verbally attacked by the protesters. After deflecting the hatred from the kids to us we started escorting the children and their families into the library. It was at that exact moment that the idea of forming a group of Guardians was born.



The Parkhill incident garnered a lot of press both in Canada and the US. Libraries and Drag Queens started reaching out for help across Ontario. The magnitude of the need was bigger than a small group of five could handle, so hence Drag Story Guardians were formed! Within a month we had hundreds of Guardians signed up to go wherever they were needed.

Guardians are everywhere! Within a short period of time, we were busy every weekend across Southern Ontario and fielding calls from libraries, pride organizers, and private venues. At most of the events, we were able to outnumber the hate. We developed ways to organize at events and ensure not just the safety of children and families but for library staff. As we grew, the haters took notice and became even more hateful and dangerous. Safety became a serious issue, and we responded with joy, celebration, and defensive tactics.

In celebrating our community, we chose to use all the flags within the rainbow. We dress in colorful clothing and welcome the children with music, applause, and joy, all the while we are also behind the front line challenging the haters, making it perfectly clear, that they are unwelcome there and we will not tolerate violence, hate speech, harassment, or intimidation. The community responded to our call, driving our membership to almost1000 Guardians. Our membership is filled with people from all walks of life. Parents, grand parents of queer kids, clergy, butches, femmes, gender fluid members, nonbinary and trans members, Drag Queens, Drag Kings and allies – anyone else you can imagine. We are all there to not just support Drag Storytime but also to show our communities that we are all there for everyone's safety.



2Spirit and IndigiQueer Coordinator

Trissa Marshal-DeSutter

Boozhoo, aniin; Indinawemaaginadog

Nizh Manidoowag Ikidowan OgichiDaa Kwe, Trissa nindizhinikaaz, Binesi ndoodem. Annishnaabe, Celtic, German ndaa. This is Anishinaabemowin for; Hello all of my relatives, my name is Trissa or Two Spirit Word Warrior Woman of the Thunderbird clan, and I am of Ojibwe, Irish and German heritage.

I am a proud Two Spirit person, with maternal ties to Zhiiabasing and Mishkagoman First Nations, acting as the 2Spirit and IndigiQueer coordinator for Oxford County Pride.

What is 2Spirit you ask? Well, it's the 2S at the beginning of 2SLGBTQIA+ acronym, placed at the beginning to honor the fact that Indigenous people were the first peoples of Turtle Island and the longest to hold respect for individual identities. Two-Spirit is an umbrella term representing our Indigenous relations who do not conform to a binary system for gender or heterosexual orientation, some indigenous people however do prefer the term IndigiQueer, so its always best to check in with the person how they identify! The most famous historical figure of Indigenous gender diversity is We'wha (1849-1896), an Ihamana or third gender person from the Zuni Pueblo Nation in what is now New Mexico.

The creation story for 2S people that resonated with me most was a story from the Wabanaki people; the hero Gluskabe who shot an arrow at the brown ash tree, cutting both the tree and the tree spirit in half. This spirit now had two parts and agreed to be transformed into people. After Gluskabe breathed into the tree, the first Wabanaki woman and man emerged. After that there was just a little bit of each essence left over, so Gluskabe recombined them and sent the first Two-Spirit out of the tree. So, in Wabanaki tradition 2S people haven't been separated from themselves.

Before colonization, being queer, trans, nonbinary etc. was not shunned, it was instead respected and understood to be another sacred part of creation. In fact, often times 2Spirit people became healers, warriors, crafters, peacekeepers, and ceremony leaders. Two spirit and IndigiQueer people have always existed, each nation having different terms for their own people. In my culture, Ojibwe it is Niizh Manidoowag, which translates to 2 spirit. This term became public and adopted among the nations of Turtle Island after a conference in 1990 for the LGBTQ Native alliance, an Elder had a vision which gave her this term to empower our Indigenous LBGTQ+ relations and to replace the derogatory term colonials had used to describe many of us since the 1600s, this was a term that was believed to be able to unite the umbrella of nation specific gender roles and sexual identities that predated European contact such as Iskwêw Ka Napêwayat in Cree, Winyanktehca in Lakota or Nádleehi in Diné.

Sadly, due to colonization ideologies of of biphobia, transphobia, and homophobia have been used to suppress those who do not fit within the homogenous world colonization did its darndest to create by means of religious indoctrination, residential schools, and patriarchal thinking. These ideologies have been left uncheck due to the ripple effects of colonization, sewing themselves into the fabrics of our social, legal, medical, education and religious systems. Further perpetuating harm and marginalizing queer and bipoc people.

Two Spirit phobia is an ideal of colonial construct and perpetuates intergenerational trauma, ignites lateral violence, increases suicide rates, and also continues to cost us our dear 2Spirit and IndigiQueer relations, taken from us by people who allow hate and misunderstanding to dictate their actions. This is happening all over Turtle Island to our youth, youth like Nex Benedict, Choctaw Nation, Oklahoma. So many



obstacles and challenges are being thrown at our youth, taking away their chance and denying creation their gifts. Queer youth DESERVE to grow up to be Queer Elders!

In Ceremony I have been taught that we are all spiritual beings living a human experience, with obligation to act with compassion, love, and empathy. These teachings and mindset have been handed down to my Anishinaabe relations by means of the Seven Grandfather Teachings.



That to know Love is to know peace, to honor all of creation is to have Respect, Courage is to face all with integrity. To be Honest in words and actions, with yourself and others, that to cherish knowledge is to know Wisdom, Humility is to know we are ALL sacred parts of Creation, and that Truth is to know all these things. Let us carry these seeds forward with us far and wide, helping to wash away these harmful belief systems in our surrounding circles, creating a better future for our young ones, where they can truly be safe and free to honor their authentic selves.

Also let us say Chi-Miigwech to our Elders who have held onto the teachings to pass down for our 2S relations, to our youth who are doing the work to explore themselves, learn the teachings and carry forward as facilitators of decolonization, and to everyone in between who loves, protects, supports, teaches, and encourages the individual identities of those around them.

Apii zaagi'iyaang, zaagi'angidwaa. As we are loved, we love others. Apii noojimo'iyaang, noojimo'angidwaa. As we are healed, we heal others.

Kina gibizamen maji mnowagazmen ambe dash ga mnowagazyen – we came to be happy, so go be happy.



Happy Pride from the Oxford County's Rainbow Coalition!





Oxford County Pride Transgender Ambassador

Since I started my transition, a lot of people ask me why I'm transitioning: "Did you just wake up one morning and decide to be a girl?" And the answer is, of course, that's not what happened at all. Transgender people live with something called Gender Dysphoria. It's commonly mistaken for a mental illness, which it definitely is not. Gender Dysphoria is defined as a deep sense of unease and distress that may occur when your biological sex does not match your gender identity. This is a very clinical definition and I don't feel it does this issue justice.

Gender Dysphoria can range from varying degrees of impact. Some individuals could be as mild as not being able to tolerate facial hair and so they aren't comfortable without being clean shaven or undergoing electrolysis/laser hair removal. In others, their genitalia could cause them so much stress that they cannot be naked, even when they're alone, without triggering major anxiety and depression, not to mention the issues that lack of intimacy can cause in a relationship. While Gender Dysphoria is not a mental illness, it can very easily cause many.

Many people do not understand what transgender people go through to make the outside match the inside. For many of us, we grow up in an environment where coming out and transitioning may not be safe or supported, or it may be downright illegal. Forcing us to go through puberty as a gender we don't identify as. Almost all of the effects of puberty are irreversible, skeletal structure changes depending on which hormones are produced by your body. Not even surgery will correct most of these changes. Male puberty changes the vocal folds causing the voice to lower, this cannot be undone and takes hours of vocal training with a speech therapist to learn to speak in a feminine tone. Musculature and fat distribution are different between males and females after puberty and it can take years or hormone therapy to for your body to rearrange itself. Breast growth also impacts male to female transitions. Once mammary tissue grows it must be surgically removed.

With all these lengthy and often irreversible changes, people who identify early push to take puberty blockers as a part of their Hormone Replacement Therapy(HRT) program until they can undergo Gender Reassignment Surgery(GRS). This tends to be very controversial. There are many, many people who are against puberty blockers. What they don't realize is, these medications can stop a lot of the irreversible changes caused by puberty, therefore eliminating a large source of Gender Dysphoria for young Transgender people, until they are old enough to make the decision to undergo GRS. None of these interventions, whether it's HRT, Puberty Blockers, or GRS should be taken lightly, and while being Transgender is by no means a mental illness, individuals should always start their journey by consulting with a qualified Gender Counsellor and research. Reaching out to organizations such as Oxford County Pride or wpath.org: the World Professional Association for Transgender Health.





Big Brothers Big Sisters of Oxford County Prism Program

My name is Alex Golden (They/He), and I am delighted to take on the coordination of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Oxford County's PRISM Program. I'm a member of the 2S/LGBTQ+ community who grew up in Tillsonburg. The challenges I faced as a young member of the 2S/LGBTQ+ community in a rural community motivated me to do my part to enrich the lives of 2S/LGBTQ+ youth in Oxford County. I am extremely grateful that BBBSOC has given me the opportunity to help empower 2S/LGBTQ+ youth in our community through the PRISM Program.

The PRISM Program, which stands for Pride, Respect, Identity, Safety, and Mentoring, matches youth who identify as part of the 2S/LGBTQ+ community with adult mentors who also identify as part of the 2S/LGBTQ+ community, in a one-to-one, school mentoring, or group mentoring relationship. All our volunteers are given pre-match training from the agency and receive ongoing support from our expert service delivery staff. Mentors in our program are guided through building a developmental relationship with intention, through regular meetings with their mentee. Matches are created based on common interests to foster a friendship that is supportive, empowering, and fun!

Historically, the 2S/LGBTQ+ community has formed informal mentoring networks as a matter of survival. Today, despite advancements in the social acceptance of 2S/LGBTQ+ people, youth in our community continue to face many challenges. Big Brothers Big Sisters is proud to share that our evidencebased mentorship programs have been effective at supporting the development of young people.

Mentorship is positive for more than just the youth being mentored; mentors often benefit from their supportive role in a young person's life. Being part of the program is rewarding in multiple ways and gives mentors the opportunity to meet new people in the 2S/LGBTQ+ community.

We have several 2S/LGBTQ+ youth on our wait list who are ready to seize the chance to explore their identities, create an empowering relationship with a mentor, and connect to the 2S/LGBTQ+ community in Oxford County.
