WALKING IN OUR TRUTH

HONOURING TWO-SPIRIT AND INDIGIQUEER RELATIVES

Since the beginning, Indigenous people have understood that every person is created with purpose and spirit. Our teachings tell us that diversity is part of Creation, and that each person carries gifts meant to strengthen community. Long before colonization, Two-Spirit and IndigiQueer people were respected, valued, and honoured. They held important roles as healers, knowledge keepers, caregivers, leaders, warriors, artists, and ceremonial people. Their presence brought balance and strength to our Nations.

As a Cree and Mohawk woman, these teachings are important to me and guide the work I do. Within our communities, Two-Spirit people have always existed and held meaningful roles. They were understood as people who carried unique gifts and perspectives, helping bring balance and connection within the circle. These teachings remind us that identity is sacred and that every person belongs.

The term Two-Spirit became more widely used in 1990 at a gathering in Winnipeg, where Indigenous LGBTQ+ relatives came together to reclaim identity and move away from harmful colonial labels. This term created space for Indigenous people to reconnect to traditional teachings, while still honouring that each Nation has its own understanding and language.

Colonization disrupted these teachings. Through residential schools, religious influence, and colonial systems, harmful beliefs about gender and identity were introduced. Homophobia and transphobia were not part of Indigenous teachings — they were imposed through colonization. These harmful beliefs created division, silence, and shame in communities that once celebrated diversity.

Today, we still see the impacts of that harm. Many Two-Spirit and IndigiQueer relatives continue to face discrimination, isolation, and violence. This is why reclaiming our teachings and creating safe spaces is so important. Our Two-Spirit youth deserve to grow up feeling safe, valued, and proud of who they are. They deserve to grow into strong leaders, knowledge keepers, and Elders within our communities.

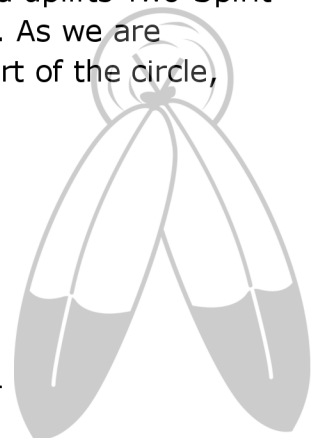
As Indigenous Ambassador of Oxford Pride and founder of Two Row Creations, I carry this responsibility within Oxford County and surrounding communities. My work focuses on creating safe, inclusive spaces where people can reconnect to culture, identity, and belonging. Through youth programming, sharing circles, workshops, community events, and cultural teachings, we continue to build understanding, healing, and connection for everyone — including our Two-Spirit and IndigiQueer relatives.

This work is about walking together. It is about learning, healing, and creating spaces where everyone feels seen and valued. It is about honouring our past while building a stronger, more inclusive future for the next seven generations.

We honour the Elders who carried these teachings forward. We honour the youth who are bravely walking in their truth. We honour everyone who supports, protects, and uplifts Two-Spirit relatives. As we are loved, let us love others. As we are healed, let us help heal others. We are all part of the circle, and each of us belongs.

PRISM is a unique mentoring program offered by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Oxford County, designed specifically to support 2S/LGBTQ+ youth. The PRISM program is dedicated to connecting youth with 2S/LGBTQ+ mentors who can walk alongside them as they navigate life's challenges.

PRISM stands for Pride, Respect, Identity, Safety, and Mentoring. Through this program, 2S/LGBTQ+ adults

are thoughtfully matched with 2S/LGBTQ+ youth in one-to-one, in-school, virtual, or group mentoring relationships. Each match begins with training focused on building safe, healthy, and affirming connections, and continues with ongoing support from our experienced mentoring coordinators.

Our mentors are equipped with the tools to foster meaningful, developmentally impactful relationships through regular, engaging weekly meetups. Matches are created based on shared interests and identities, helping to build connections that are supportive, empowering, and genuinely fun.

Historically, 2S/LGBTQ+ communities have relied on informal networks of care and mentorship to navigate adversity. While progress has been made, many 2S/LGBTQ+ individuals in Oxford County still face discrimination and barriers. PRISM responds to this need with an evidence-based mentoring approach that nurtures confidence, belonging, and positive development in young people.

Mentors consistently describe their experience as deeply rewarding. It's an opportunity to build meaningful connections, strengthen community, and support the next generation—while also enriching your own sense of purpose and wellbeing. With flexible program options, mentoring can fit into your schedule with as little as one hour per week.

There are currently 2S/LGBTQ+ youth on our waitlist, eager to be matched with a mentor. If you are a 2S/LGBTQ+ adult or an ally looking to make a difference, PRISM offers a powerful way to give back and create lasting impact.

ADVANCING 2SLGBTQIA+ HEALTH IN OXFORD COUNTY

OXFORD AND ELGIN COUNTY
RAINBOW RESEARCH

2SLGBTQIA+ communities are strong, diverse, and resilient. While there have been important strides in rights and visibility, many in our communities still face discrimination, healthcare barriers, and stressors that affect both mental and physical health. This year, a local initiative is working to build on that resilience by continuing to advance research aimed at improving the health and well-being of 2SLGBTQIA+ folks in Oxford and Elgin Counties.

Through a partnership between Wilfrid Laurier University, Oxford County's Rainbow Coalition, Elgin County Pride, and Southwestern Public Health, this research project is one of the first of its kind in our region. The project is specifically exploring the unique health challenges faced by sexual orientation and gender identity/expression (SOGIE) diverse communities in rural-urban settings, communities too often left out of national conversations.

The Oxford-Elgin Rainbow Research initiative is working to change that by collecting both survey data and in-depth interviews about lived experiences to uncover where supports are most needed, and how to make them happen. Through this work, our research team is dedicated to co-creating solutions with our local communities.

The research team will be on-site at Pride this year, recruiting for the survey and interviews about 2SLGBTQIA+ health and experiences in the region. Participants who complete the survey or interview will receive a gift card token of appreciation for their time.

To be eligible, participants must be 16 years of age or older, live in either Oxford or Elgin County, and identify under the 2SLGBTQIA+ umbrella. Your voice matters, and your story can help build a healthier, more inclusive Oxford County.

OXFORD COUNTY WARDEN'S MESSAGE

Pride Month is a time to reflect. Not just on history and visibility, but on belonging. On being able to live openly as yourself, right here in your own community. Across Oxford County, that experience is not the same for everyone.

That is why Pride Month matters.

In February, Oxford County Council approved the new Safe & Well Oxford Plan (2026–2029), which identifies “people and belonging” as one of six priority areas. The Plan was shaped by feedback from residents in both rural and urban communities, reflecting real experiences of isolation and challenges. It brings together community partners to coordinate services and reduce barriers, helping residents feel more connected, safe, and supported.

For me, Pride is both a celebration and a reminder. It asks us to pay attention to people’s experiences and to keep challenging discrimination in all its forms, so that everyone, regardless of age, geography, background or identity, can feel a true sense of belonging.
